Open to all, the Service committee plans and implements service actions in the middle school for the benefit of others in the school and outside as well.

Fall Musical

Open to all in grades 6-12, but students must audition for parts to participate on stage. Some additional crew spots are also available.

Mythology Club

Open to any 8th graders | Prepare for the National Mythology Exam in March | Includes games, crossword puzzles, reading, and a willingness not to be afraid of weird-sounding names!

Girls Bible Study

Specifically designed for middle school girls, and led by a female teacher. A great opportunity to grow in biblical understanding and love for the Lord.

Art Club

Based on interest, only 14 students can be selected - priority is given to 8th graders, then 7th, then 6th. Club time is focused on preparation for ACSI competition and expanding art skills.

Choir/Music

Everyone who is not in the Band gets to participate in this music instruction and appreciation. This group is both academic and interesting.

Outdoors Club

Open to all students interested in spending more time outside, walking, hiking, fishing, or just enjoying the natural beauty of the park outside the school building.
